Through La Luz, she has been tutoring native Spanish-speakers who are learning English. She considers her time a "win-win" as her Spanish improves along with their English. She has enjoyed getting to know them and their different interests and backgrounds. Denise believes volunteering "pushes you out of your boundaries a little bit. When your Spanish isn't amazing, you have to be willing to learn with them." According to Denise, "if you are interested in Spanish and getting to know people, this is a great opportunity". BUILDING UPDATES

La Luz Centro Cultural is moving forward with realizing a dream for a warm and welcoming space for the community. Last year, we purchased a building large enough to accommodate a cultural center that will bring life, color, hospitality and togetherness. Our vision for the space is coming together thanks to community input and support. With initial grant funding from the State of Iowa Rural Innovation Grant and Main Street Iowa Challenge Grant, we contracted the services of SB&A Architects and have entered into the first stages of the project to bring these dreams to a reality.

As the plans come together, we would love to share with you the enthusiasm and dreams we have for each area!

- Family Room: a space designed for children to safely wait while their parents are visiting the center—complete with toys, a small TV, and comfy furniture.
- Classrooms: two large rooms to accommodate our ever-growing English language classes. With a moveable partition in-between, this space can transform into one large room to hold big events.
- Commercial Kitchen: a small but powerful kitchen will allow us to hold cultural cooking classes and even host dinner fundraisers with easy access to our large gathering space.
- Food Pantry: with a dedicated door and window, clients can receive food pantry services while maintaining the privacy many desire.
- Bathrooms & Shower: these spaces will enhance our ability to provide a hospitable center with important amenities like baby changing stations and a washer/dryer area.
- Emergency Shelter: incorporating many of the features listed above, this area will be accessible in times of emergency need while keeping the rest of the building secure. With access to the kitchen, bathrooms, shower, and a convertible room for sleeping, this emergency shelter will be available to those escaping a dangerous situation or a disaster until a more stable solution is found.


